Generating Donations

The year 2022 was all about networking. Through constant exchange at events, we were able to bring our project to the attention of many people, which had previously not been so easy due to COVID. As expected, the commitment to child welfare enjoys broad social approval. This great enthusiasm is in no small part due to the tireless efforts of our great helpers, who have attracted people's attention almost magnetically - the number of memberships has risen to over 100 people in 2022. The annual planning for 2022 included the realization of some exciting projects, especially festivals.

We are especially proud to have participated in the famous Fusion Festival, where we introduced attendees to our association. In addition to excellent music, the people there also found the time to confront serious issues such as the precarious conditions in the Philippines. The high revenue generated there, the contacts made, and the exchange of ideas represent an important part of our work.

Moreover, we had an event at Ritter Butzke in Berlin in May at which we successfully ran a booth providing educational outreach, selling Space Lama merchandise, and recruiting new members. Our newly enlisted active Berlin members did a wonderful job here.

In July, we then ran an information booth at the SNNTG festival. On the grounds of a railroad museum, we were able to achieve groundbreaking success and generated



profits that far exceeded our expectations. We also made many new acquaintances and by the end of the weekend almost every person there knew "Space Lama". Among other things, we drew attention to ourselves with our mango shot, which is produced from Philippine mangoes by Preda. Other booths also willingly displayed our merchandise - simply because our cause had convinced them. It was here that we sold a large part of the 300 socks we produced.

We also secured profits and some new supporters, especially in the circles of aspiring doctors, at the Medi-Meisterschaften ("medical championship") in September, where we took part in the "PFAND-RAISING" (vaguely "deposit collection") project. In several shifts and alongside other charitable associations, we collected tens of thousands of empty beverage cans and returnable bottles there. The proceeds of the collection were then divided among the associations according to the amount of time they spent working. On top of that, our chairman Hamid Kamrani was able to attract the attention of more young people here by giving a keynote speech.

Revenue is also generated by a current Netto (a German discounter) campaign allowing customers to donate directly to Space Lama at four locations in Homburg according to the motto "Round up, please".

Furthermore, we would like to thank Marius Müller for 1,000 Instagram followers and for advertising us on his soccer show "Mein FCK" broadcast on Südwestrundfunk.

Another milestone this year was completing our first promotional video, which allows our message to be accessed "on demand" from anywhere in the world.

Child welfare

Once again Space Lama succeeded in rescuing a number of minors in the Philippines this year. A girl named Hope was reportedly raped by her uncle when she was only eight years old. In April, in cooperation with PREDA, we were able to liberate Hope (16) from a resort associated with drug as well as sexual abuse. She had been picked up by her aunt after school, drugged against her will, and then raped by a stranger.



When she finally opened up to her boyfriend, they both turned to Hope's parents. On April 25, 2022, she was referred to PREDA Foundation by a social investigator. PREDA facilitated therapeutic sessions for the girl, and she was able to make some new acquaintances at the PREDA home for girls.

In addition, Space Lama e.V. is currently taking care of the rescue of a minor who experienced sexual abuse in the context of the Catholic Church in the Philippines.

At the beginning of the new year, we were able to release 14-year-old Daniel from a children's prison. Daniel suffered the same fate as many other young people, some of whom are locked up for long periods of time, either innocently or for minor crimes, in accommodation disguised as a youth home but with an atmosphere resembling that of a prison. We are proud to announce that this year six of our members have organized and undertaken a trip to the Philippines. On this trip, we were able to get first-hand impressions of the conditions of such a youth home, completely unexpectedly. We used the trip to get a more detailed, personal picture of the situation on site and to establish and maintain important contacts. The experiences we gathered there fully confirmed our previous work. The stories of the children and young people affected are deeply moving and once again highlight the importance and necessity of our association's purpose.

Our trip to the Philippines

After a long delay due to the pandemic, we were finally able to fly to the Philippines in September 2022 to get a first-hand account of the situation on the ground. In a meeting with our chairman Hamid Kamrani and various experts on site, a decline in the commercial sexual exploitation of children in the Philippines was confirmed, among other things. However, a rapid growth was seen in the online trade with staged depictions of children and adolescents. This digital type of sexual exploitation of children is referred to as OSEC (Online Sexual Exploitation of Children). We are currently working on adapting our approach to this rapid development and will in future be working closely with initiatives in Germany dealing with this problem. For a total of 10 days we were allowed to visit the PREDA "Girls Home" and accompany the children as well as the staff in their everyday life.

Financial report

We are proud to report that our total income has more than doubled compared to last year! The contributions from our active and supporting members have more than tripled and now form a healthy foundation for our work. Last year we allocated almost EUR 20,000 to the PREDA foundation. Our expenses consist of the costs for production of Space Lama merchandise, festival equipment, various fees, software licenses, and promotional items (including flyers, banners, and posters). Chart 2 discloses our finances from 2022. Working as transparently as possible is very important to us in order to further strengthen the faith that has been invested in us. It is also worth highlighting the consistently high level of donations we received. The breakdown of donations is shown in illustration 3. Since donors often do not have a long-term relationship with the association or active members, preferring instead to spontaneously support our work, we feel particularly validated in our efforts by the direct donations.




Illustration 4: Depiction of donation shares.
